Definition- Value is a measure of relative lightness or darkness.

Class work

On 8 by 11 inch Bristol Board make three (3) separate value charts one using (A) Graphite, (B) one using Acrylic paint and (C) one using a Black ink pen

- The value scale of each chart should be in the range of seven (7) values. Value #1 should be the white paper or white paint and Value #7 should be the blackest black.
- Start by drawing 7 boxes across your paper approximately 1 x 1 inch. This can be on the back of the Bristol board.
- Next draw two more rows of boxes beneath it.
- Number the values 1- 7.
- Try to match the values of each media to the box above it.

(D) Using a Black and White Photo (or photocopy) cut it in half and complete it in graphite. This photocopy can be enlarged to any size. One half of the work should match the other in terms of value. The half, which is matched, should be glued on the front or back of Bristol board for comparison.
